Search for Area Carjacker

Police are investigating a pair of carjackings of elderly drivers in suburban New Jersey that appear to have been committed by the same man.

The first incident took place about 8:40 a.m. on November 14, 2012, in Pine Hill, at West Branch Avenue and Blackwood roads. The suspect approached an older driver stopped at a traffic light with a box cutter, got in his vehicle and forced him to drive to North Camden to buy heroin. The suspect also took the victim's cell phone and \$400.

About 7 a.m. on November 24 a similar incident occurred in Clementon. Again an older driver was approached while stopped at a traffic light, this time at Gibbsboro and Blackwood roads, and an armed man forced his way into the car. This person carried a large knife. He took \$100 from the driver and ordered him to drive to 8th and Erie streets in Camden, where he got out of the vehicle.

Based on descriptions provided by the victims, and the nature of the crimes, investigators suspect the same person is responsible for both. He was described as a white male, about 25 years old, unshaven, standing about five-feet-seven-inches tall. He had brown hair grown to the midway point on his neck. Included are images taken on November 13 of the person investigators believe is their suspect.
