
STATEMENT OF CIRCUMSTANCES:


During the early morning hours of Friday, 2/21/2014 Ptl. Marino was patrolling the area of Blackwood-Clementon Road. During his patrol he observed a motor vehicle in violation of NJS 39:3-66 maintenance of lamps and 39:4-88b, failure to maintain lane. At approximately 2:53am he conducted a motor vehicle stop with PA registration, JHW-9835 in the 1200 block of Blackwood-Clementon Road. The driver, Ryan V. Stewart was arrested for an outstanding warrant out of Wildwood. During the stop he conducted a field interview with Mr. Stewart who informed him that the vehicle contained CDS, specifically "Dope" referring to Heroin. He further advised him that the front seat passenger was in possession of it. Based on the information given by the driver, all occupants were removed from the vehicle and searched. During the investigation the driver provided Ptl. Marino with consent to search the vehicle. The two female passengers, Taylor Farlow and Megan A. Hudson also agreed to provide him with consent to search their purses.


During the investigation and subsequent search in the center console Ptl. Marino located (14) bags of Heroin stamped ("White Magic"), a small plastic jar containing PCP, and two small white pills inside a cigarette wrapper labeled TEVA 834, identified as Clonazepam. A further search of the trunk yielded the discovery of a Glock 19, 9mm semi-automatic handgun inside a tool bag loaded with (12) hollow nose bullets. A subsequent search of Taylor Farlow's purse led to the discovery of (4) additional bags of heroin stamped ("White Magic"). Megan Hudson's purse contained 3.5 pills labeled "Watson 349" identified as Hydrocodone 500mg none of which she had a prescription for. All occupants of the vehicle were arrested, processed and charged accordingly.

Ryan V. Stewart, John M. Nesspor, Taylor Farlow and Megan A. Hudson were charged with; Possession of a Weapon for Unlawful Purpose, Possession of Hollow Nose Bullets, Possession of a Weapon While Distributing CDS, Possession of Heroin, Possession of Heroin with Intent to Distribute, Possession of a Controlled Dangerous Substance (X's 2). Ryan Stewart was additionally charged with Driving While License is Suspended or Revoked, Maintenance of Lamps, Failure to maintain Lane, Violation of Touring Privileges and Impeding Traffic. Ryan Stewart was remanded to the Camden County Correctional facility in Default of \$123,000 bail. John M. Nesspor was remanded to the Camden County Correctional Facility in Default of \$75,000 bail. Taylor Farlow was remanded the Camden County Correctional Facility in default of \$80,000 bail. Megan A. Hudson was released pending an appearance in Superior Court.

Ptl. Marino is commended for his drive, determination and professionalism during this investigation which led to the seizure of a quantity of Heroin, and loaded handgun and prescription narcotics. Ptl. Marino is a credit to the Pine Hill Police Association and the community he serves.




STATEMENT OF CIRCUMSTANCES:

On January 26th, 2014 at approximately 1951 hours Patrolman Raynore attempted to conduct a motor vehicle stop in the 100 block of Blackwood-Clementon Road. The driver of the vehicle refused to stop and initiated a motor vehicle pursuit. Patrolman Raynore pursued the vehicle a short distance as it entered into the Birches Apartment Complex, located at 105 Blackwood-Clementon Road in Lindenwold, NJ.


The driver jumped from the moving vehicle and ran into the 900 building of the Birches Apartment complex. The vehicle, occupied by one passenger continued moving until it left the roadway and struck a tree. The passenger, Dennis Day was not injured and was taken into custody as additional assisting officers began searching for the driver.

With the assistance of Officers from the Lindenwold Police Department, the driver was located in an apartment within the 900 building, hiding in a cabinet under a sink in the kitchen. The driver physically resisted arrest, but was taken into custody without injury himself or the Officers. The passenger unsuccessfully attempted to destroy a quantity of Marijuana while at Police Headquarters. Both arrestees were processed accordingly and remanded to the Camden County Correctional facility in default of bail.

Patrolman Raynore should be commended for his ability to maintain a high level of professionalism while taking these two dangerous criminals in custody without injury to himself or to the suspects. His professionalism is a credit to the Department and the community he serves.
