Three suspects have been arrested for receiving stolen property as a result of the investigation into two residential burglaries in the 900 block of Turnersville Road. The burglaries occurred on Wednesday, April 11<sup>th</sup>, 2012 between the early morning hours and 4:00pm. Both scenes were processed and evidence was collected by the Pine Hill Detective Bureau.

At approximately 11:30 on April 11<sup>th</sup>, a local business owner alerted police to two suspicious males in the 800 block of Erial Road. The investigating officer located Charles S. Mauger and Jeffrey C. Werner and they were found to be in possession of a large quantity of miscellaneous jewelry. Neither of the suspects could provide an account of the origin of the jewelry. Jeffrey Werner was arrested after active warrants were confirmed for his arrest. He was released after posting bail. Both suspects were released, but the jewelry was held pending further investigation. The Department was notified of the residential burglaries several hours later and the victims provided detailed descriptions of the items stolen, matching that of the items recovered earlier in the day. Investigating officers recovered additional stolen items from a local dealer and obtained information linking Jenna Labor to the sale of the stolen items.

Warrants were issued for the arrest of Charles Mauger 4<sup>th</sup> and Jeffrey Werner for receiving stolen property. Charles Mauger was taken into custody on April 17, 2012 after being arrested in Berlin Borough in an unrelated incident. Mauger was remanded to the Camden County Correctional Facility in default of \$10,000.00 bail.

A warrant was issued for the arrest of Jenna Labor for receiving stolen property and she was taken into custody on April 18, 2012 in Burlington County. She was provided information regarding the sale of the stolen property and other items. She was remanded to the Camden County Correctional Facility in default of \$20,000.00 bail.

Pine Hill Officers arrested Jeffrey Werner on April 22, 2012 at his residence on Skyline Drive in Sicklerville. A family member initially provided false information to the officers in reference to his location, but he was located during a search of the residence, hiding behind towels in a bedroom closet. Werner was remanded to the Camden County Correctional Facility in default of \$10,000.00 bail. On Tuesday, April 24<sup>th</sup> at 6:06pm, officers were dispatched to the area of the 1400 building in the Mansions Apartments for the report of a robbery. Responding officers located the victim, a female 59 years of age, in the area of the 100 building. The victim reported she was walking in the area of the 800 building when she was approached from behind by a white female wearing black pants and a gray hooded sweatshirt. The suspect forcibly grabbed her purse, resulting in a struggle. The victim fell to the ground during the struggle, resulting in injuries to her wrist.

Investigating officers located a witness in the area of the 100 building who provided the suspect's identity and possible location. Continued investigation led officers to the 100 building of the Mansions Apartments where the suspect was located. Consent was obtained for the search of the suspect's residence, resulting in the recovery of the purse and contents hidden under the kitchen sink.

Michele Fidanza was taken into custody and subsequently provided investigating officers with a detailed description of the incident, admitting her involvement. She was charged with Robbery and remanded to the Camden County Correctional Facility in default of \$25,000.00 bail. The victim was transported by family members to the hospital for treatment of a broken wrist.

On April 24<sup>th</sup>, 2012 residents in the Pine Hill area received a pre-recorded message regarding a missing and endangered child. The message was sent by the Child is Missing organization at the request of investigating officers and has proven to be an effective tool to assist in locating missing persons who may be children, elderly or mentally or physically challenged or disabled. Below is a description of how the program works.

Effective December 2010, upon receipt of a missing persons call, the department will make its first phone call to a toll-free number that rings in Fort Lauderdale, Florida—the national headquarters of the A Child Is Missing Alert Program. The call, answered 24/7/365 by an Information and Mapping Technician, initiates a rapid process of information gathering and use of sophisticated mapping systems. A Child Is Missing then launches potentially thousands of calls within minutes with an alert message detailing the missing person’s description, last known whereabouts, and pertinent information. This alert message will also include a Pine Hill Police Department phone number for use by anyone with information relating to the missing person.

This program is a free service to law enforcement. Investigating officers will evaluate each potential activation of the A Child Is Missing Alert Program to ensure the application is appropriate to the case and to ensure the system is optimally used. Policies, procedures, and employee training will also guide the most efficient and effective use of this Alert Program.

Phone numbers that are called by this program include listed numbers and mobile numbers available to ACIM in the selected area. Mobile numbers, unlisted numbers, broadband/voice-over IP numbers, or TDD/TTY devices can be added to ensure they, too, are called in the event of an alert. To enter your cell phone, unlisted, broadband/voice-over IP or TDD/TTY device number visit [www.achildismissing.org](http://www.achildismissing.org) and click on “add your name” to enter your name, number, and address. This information will only be used for emergency message alerts.

On April 28<sup>th</sup> 2012 at approximately 0255 hours Pine Hill Officers were dispatched to 1323 Erial Road (Pine Hill Tavern) for the report of a male attempting to light the establishment on fire. A witness called 9-1-1 and reported seeing a male pouring gasoline around the building and attempting to ignite it with a lighter. The witness yelled for the male to stop before he successfully ignited the fire, at which time he fled on Erial Road. Responding Pine Hill Officers and assisting Officers from the Lindenwold and Clementon Police Departments conducted a search of the area. During the search a gas can believed to be used in the incident was located on Erial Road.

At approximately 0315 hours an assisting Officer from the Lindenwold Police Department located a male, matching the description provided by the witness, on 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue in Pine Hill. His clothes were wet and there was a strong odor of gasoline coming from them. The witness confirmed it was the male who had poured the gasoline and attempted to ignite the fire. The male, identified as Joshua A. Ford, 30 years of age from Woodlawn Avenue in Clementon, was taken into custody without incident.

Ford was transported to Kennedy Health Systems, Stratford Division for injuries sustained during a physical altercation at the Pine Hill Tavern earlier in the night. Pine Hill Officers were dispatched to the Pine Hill Tavern at approximately 0136 hours for the report of a fight in progress, but all involved parties had fled the scene prior to their arrival. Ford was cleared for incarceration, charged with 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree Attempted Aggravated Arson and remanded to the Camden County Correctional Facility in default of \$75,000.00 bail. 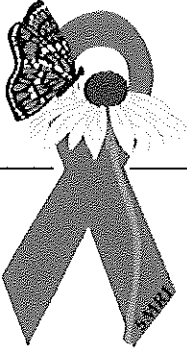
