
SIGNIFICANT INVESTIGATIONS / EVENTS / UPDATES

- *During the month of March 13 firearms were seized during narcotics investigations, including 5 rifles, 4 shotguns and 4 handguns*
- **Case #2012000443** – March 06, 2012 0830 hours Officers executed a search warrant at the culmination of a one month investigation into the distribution of CDS from the 100 block of Kirk Lane. The search led to the seizure of 11 firearms, including a Thompson sub-machine gun and a 9mm handgun, chambered and cocked, loaded with hollow-point ammunition. A quantity of Marijuana, narcotic pills and CDS paraphernalia were also seized, along with over \$12,000.00 cash. Daniel Tomaziefski of Kirk Lane was charged with possession of CDS with the intent to distribute and related offenses.
- **Case #2012002337** – March 06, 2012 Officers arrested William Henderson of 1035 Turnersville Road on two counts of second degree Sexual Assault. Henderson was remanded to the Camden County Correctional Facility in default of bail.

SIGNIFICANT INVESTIGATIONS / EVENTS / UPDATES CONTINUED

- **Case #2012002967** – March 19, 2012 2156 hours Officers responded to the area of Cross Road and W. Branch Avenue for the report of shots fired in the area. Initial responding Officers encountered James A. Broaddus coming from the rear of a residence with blood on his hands. Continued investigation led to the arrest of James Broaddus who was found to be in possession of narcotics pills with the intent to distribute the same. Over \$7500.00 in cash was seized from Broaddus. A .38 special revolver was recovered in the area, along with four unspent cartridges.
- **Case #2012002747** – March 30, 2012 Officers executed a search warrant at the culmination of a three week investigation resulting in the seizure of a shotgun, over 1 ounce of Cocaine packaged for distribution, a quantity of Marijuana, a quantity of K-2 synthetic Marijuana and CDS paraphernalia. Investigation is on-going.
- On Wednesday, March 28th, 2012 the Pine Hill Police Department and Pine Hill School District hosted the Philadelphia Police Department H.E.A.D.S. UP Program. The program was attended by over 120 eighth grade students at the Pine Hill Middle School. The program was very well received by the students and faculty at the school and will hopefully be available to schedule annually to supplement the Department DARE program.
- On Thursday, March 29th, 2012 Ptl. Witts and K-9 Cliff assisted the Audubon School District with a “shelter in place” drill, during which the team conducted narcotics searches within the junior-senior high school. Refer to attached letter dated April 2, 2012.
- The department received a letter from the operator of a vehicle involved in a serious motor vehicle crash on January 8, 2012 thanking Ptl. Heron for his actions during the incident. The letter is a tremendous reflection of the professionalism displayed by Ptl. Heron and the Department as a whole. Refer to attached letter
- DARE Officer Muller instructed the students at the John H. Glenn School on the following topics; Harmful effects of Tabacco, Alcohol and Marijuana, Truth in Advertising and Dangers of Inhalants and Methamphetamine, Friendship Foundation, Peer Pressure and Bullying, Types of Peer Pressure and Bullying with Ways to Be in Charge, Personal Actions and the DARE Decision Making Model.
- 3000 “Private Children’s I.D. Record” booklet have been ordered through the New Jersey State Council of the Knight of Columbus. The kits are free of charge and will display the department patch. See Attached example

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you on behalf of our staff, student body, and community for your department's willingness to share the canine unit of Patrolman Christopher Witts and Cliff with our school district for our "shelter in place" drill last Thursday. This was a combined effort of our local police department, your unit and a similar canine team from the Camden County Sheriff's Department.

Bringing canine narcotic detector teams to our junior-senior high school sent a very clear message to our student population regarding our zero tolerance for illegal substances in our building. Although the dogs did not 'hit' on any lockers, the resulting behavior of a number of our students led to their being identified. As a result, there will be the usual consequences for such behavior and involvement in programs designed to effect a change in their behavior. In addition, the student body has a heightened sense regarding our commitment to making sure our schools remain drug free.

I also want to commend the professionalism of your officer and Cliff. Our administration was impressed with their level of concern and their capabilities. It is comforting to see such a high level of training, which we know will be available to us in any emergency situation.

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I am writing this letter to the Pine Hill Police Dept. to recognize a Police officer named officer Heron. Several months ago I was in a very severe car accident. I have been in 3 different Hospitals I for acute Rehabilitation. This accident occurred on January 8th 2012. I'm still unable to walk and waiting on my 4th surgery. This event in my life has changed my whole outlook on life. It changed me so much, like I was given a second chance & this time I'm doing it right! This officer Heron I was not on very good terms with, but that morning of the accident I was so incredibly afraid, no one was there, no recognizable faces. I thought what a horrible way to die all alone. I tried

holding someone's arm and pleaded with him to please help me. He was so unbelievably cold to me and scolded me to let him go and not grab him again. I felt so alone and afraid. Then I saw him appear. Heron at first I wasn't sure how he would react, but it was like he saw in my eyes the good I had inside me, not the bad the the rest always seem to see. He told me it would be OK. I held his arm and asked him not to leave. He stayed with me and it didn't seem to bother him in the least even when I squeezed his arm so hard. Out of fear, just trying to stay awake. He knelt beside the car door with me until the jaws of life cut the car so I could be released, but it was only then that he left and explained to me why

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and that I was going to be
OK. I was removed from the
car & placed in an ambulance
to the chopper to go to Cooper.
The dr's told me if I didn't
get there when I did I probably
would have died. I believe I
was dying in that car with all
the internal injuries and outer
ones it was a miracle they told
my family & I believe if it wasn't
for officer Heron and his
extreme kindness and not
judging me of the person I
was, but as a special human
being that deserved to live.
I saw in his eyes what truth
was there and how he really
wanted to help me. I will
always be grateful for him. He is
my hero from the moment I held
his arm, he gave me hope &
strength that someone cared. I
fought to stay alive! THANK YOU

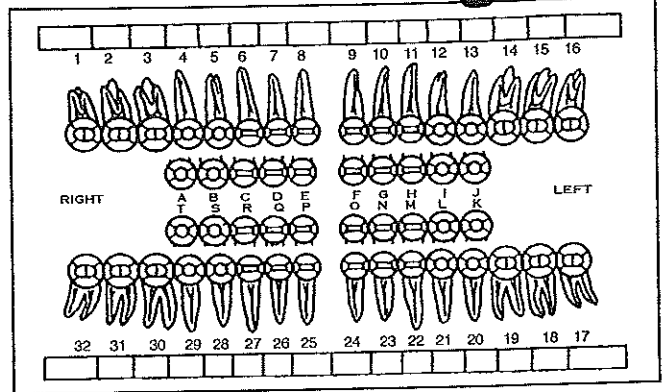
